



Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell took part in the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged and enriched by a succession of leading organ builders: most recently, Nicholsons of Malvern in 2010. Organists of the church have included the composer William Boyce, Richard Limpus (who founded the [Royal] College of Organists here), Harold Darke and Richard Popplewell. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world (it began in 1914).
