



Some of the 3,500 pipes of this fine organ are over 300 years old. Since Henry Purcell took part in the opening recital in 1684, the instrument has been enlarged by a succession of leading organ builders: most recently, Nicholsons of Malvern in 2010. Organists of the church have included composers William Boyce and Harold Darke. Richard Limpus founded the [Royal] College of Organists here. The weekly recitals series is thought to be the longest-running in the world (it began in 1914).
